To whom it may concern,

This document is not evidence of identity, of eligibility to work or of the right of abode in the United Kingdom. It does not confer any additional status or rights but simply records the fact that, based on the information and evidence provided, the Secretary of State considers the person named below to have the status shown.

This is to confirm that an opinion has been sought on the nationality status of [REDACTED] born [REDACTED] in Birmingham, United Kingdom.

The following evidence was provided:

- Subject's UK birth certificate naming his father
- Subject's father's certificate of Irish citizenship

A person's nationality status is a legal matter which only the courts can determine conclusively. However, based on the evidence listed above, the Secretary of State is of the opinion that [REDACTED] is a British citizen under section 1(1)(b) of the British Nationality Act 1981.
